You will learn the fourth and final set of phonies sounds in French. The sounds introduced in this lesson are: QU GNE Ç EN AN.

You will learn the nouns and determiners/definite articles for ten school subjects in French. You will also learn how to conjugate the verb 'to study', an introduction to time and an expansion of opinions.


You will learn the nouns and determiners for ten 'healthy' and ten 'less healthy' foods, along with the $1^{\text {st }}$ person singular conjugation of the high frequency verbs 'to eat' and 'to drink'.

You will learn ten phrases for activities you may do at the weekend in French. You will also be presented with further extension on telling the time and opinions / justifications.


You will learn about other countries around the globe that speak French. You will also learn about the currencies, flags, cultural celebrations and traditions of those countries.


You will learn five new sounds è, é, e, eux and eau. You will also continue to revise the alphabet, vowels and the phonics Phonics 3 that you have previously learnt.

 il?You will learn how to describe the weather. You will learn how to ask and answer the question 'What is the weather today?' You will learn the names of different points of a compass and be able to use this to describe the weather in different places.

You will learn the names of at least four different pets. You will be able to use the phrases 'I have a...' and 'I don't have a ...' to describe the pets that you have. You will be able to ask others if they have a pet. You will be able to say what your pet is called and use adjectives to describe your pet.


You will learn how to say and spell correctly the days of the week, the months of the year and numbers 1-31. You will be able to ask and answer the question 'What is today's date?' You will be able to say the date of your birthday.

You will be able to say the name for a variety of different clothing.. You will become familiar with the verb 'porter' and use this to describe what you and your friends are wearing. You will be able to say what clothing you wear in different
 weather conditions.

## Our Lower Key Stage 2 Languages Journey



You will learn four new sounds i, in, ique and ille and accents. You will continue to revise the alphabet, vowels and the sounds ch, ou, on and oi.

You will learn to count to 20 and to say your name and age in French. You will learn to greet somebody using hello and goodbye and be able to ask how they are feeling and explain how you feel. You will learn how to say where you live and give your nationality. You will also be able to understand gender agreement rules.


You will learn to say the members, names and ages of those in a family and count up to 100 . You will understand the possessive adjectives 'mon', 'ma' and 'mes', and use the $1^{\text {st }}$ person singular and $3^{\text {rd }}$ person singular verb forms of s'appeler and avoir.

You will learn to give the location of and say if you live in a house or apartment and be able to repeat, recognise and spell up to 10 room names. You will be able to explain which rooms are in your house and ask someone which rooms they have.


You will learn to order foods and drinks from a French menu including breakfast items and snacks. You will learn to ask for the bill and remember to use please, thank you, hello and goodbye.

You will be introduced to the French alphabet, French vowels and learn how to pronounce the graphemes: ch, ou, on and oi.

You will place France on a map and discover that many other countries around the world speak French too. You will then learn how to greet somebody using hello and goodbye, say how you are feeling as well as what your name is. You will be able to count to 10 and learn the name of French colours.

You will learn the name of common vegetables and understand how to say 'I would like...' . You will then progress to being able to order a kilo of your chosen vegetable and learn the word for please.

You will learn the name of up to ten instruments. You will be introduced to some French grammar and understand more about definite articles and determiners. You will be able to say 'I play' and use it in a small sentence.

By listening to a familiar traditional fairy tale, you will become more confident at listening to and reading texts in French. You will learn key words and phrases from the story as well as the name of ten main body parts.
